Amphenol: Glenn Nealis updated the board on the Sidney Center project. Army Corps of Engineers is coming for a site visit Monday. Amphenol is pushing on them for their escrow. We have threatened eminent domain on Northstar who holds a mortgage for a piece of property in Sidney Center.

Project Updates: Glenn Nealis updated the board on the Ames building. He is working with the Town and the Village of Delhi to build the justification for the market in this area based on things that don't show up on the census data like college students and the second homeowner market. They had a list of prospects they wanted to send this to.

DPW Study: Planning submitted a grant to fund a study for DPW regarding efficiencies and possible consolidations. We had a gentleman from Rochester give a presentation on this to find additional ways to seek out efficiencies for towns and villages to save tax payers money. That grant was denied. Wayne from public works is still very interested if the IDA would continue to push this idea and seek funding.

Wissahickon: Glenn informed the board that we have an incentive offer out to one of George's contacts for an as is sale. It would be selling the building as is and then working with them to transfer our grant to them for renovating the building.

DEP Hydro Project: Glenn updated the board. Glenn arranged for a meeting with DCEC and DEP. The meeting was very productive.

Personal Health Care: Jim Thomson and Glenn Nealis met with Personal Health Care. They are interested in buying the infirmary. They are waiting on their certificate of need. They have architectural drawings of what they plan to do. They plan on knocking down half of it. The facility will be a little bigger than what was there previously and will be state of the art.

IDA Pump Station: Jim Thomson said there are two issues. The first issue is we need to upgrade and replace pumps. The more immediate need is for pieces that need to be rebuilt right now. Jim Thomson approved the pieces being rebuilt

Casella: We are still waiting for appraisal from Lonnie Ridgeway. Casella is looking for a year end closing. Lonnie expects to get us the appraisal by Monday or Tuesday.

Glenn updated the board on two new prospects that we are working on. One is in the Sidney area, Norwich Engineering. They are looking for 2500 – 3500 sq ft. It would create about 15-20 jobs. The second came to us through DCEC for a new dairy processing facility in the county. They are looking to processing in the organic realm and would like to turn their location here into a tourism type of attraction.

Amigo Chicken: A motion by Scott White, second by George Bergleitner, to deny loan, motion passed.

HRP Associates – Brownfield discussion: Glenn updated the board that him and Jim had a follow up call on Vitale Lumber & GCL Tie in Sidney. They are going to reach out to DEC and to find out what they would require.

Constitution Pipeline: Board discussed.
